The Pulaski County Civil War Sesquicentennial Committee is in the process of compiling a burial register of soldier's graves in the county. A brief history (if available) of the soldier would like to be included in the register. Rank, regiment, branch, state, enlistment date and discharge date. A birth date and place, cemetery name and location, is the grave marked, Confederate or Union. Also the maiden name of spouse, her birth date and place, marriage record, children's names. Once the register is completed it will be on display at the Pulaski County Courthouse Museum and the public libraries.

The General Assembly of Virginia created the Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission in 2006 (HB 1440) to prepare for and commemorate the sesquicentennial of Virginia's participation in the American Civil War.
